PERSPECTIVE: Whose Got Your Joy? -Pastor Dan Morgan, Phil 3:1-30, 5/13/18

Context:

- ✓ The Apostle Paul *planted* the church in Philippi on his second missionary **journey** around <u>52</u> A.D.
- ✓ This is Paul's "thank you" letter in 62 A.D.
- ✓ Paul wrote Philippians from a Roman *prison* while awaiting potential execution.

Finally, my brothers, <u>rejoice</u> in the Lord! It is no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, and it is a safeguard for you. Phil 3:1

Rejoice Defined: "to feel great delight, welcome or be glad, from within. To be content" Joy / Joyful / Rejoice = 16x in Philippians.

Happy Defined: "state of well being, pleasure or satisfying experience based on circumstances / things outside"

Jesus said:

- The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full. John 10:10
- I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.
 John 15:11
- So with you: Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy. John 16:22

JOY IS STOLEN WHEN...

1) ...I Replace Relationship with RULES.

Watch out for those <u>dogs</u>, those men who do evil, those mutilators of the flesh. ³ For it is we who are the circumcision, we who worship by the Spirit of God, who glory in Christ Jesus, and who put <u>no confidence in the flesh</u>-⁴ though I myself have reasons for such confidence. Philippians 3:3-4

If anyone else thinks he has reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵ circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for legalistic righteousness, faultless.

Philippians 3:5-6

2) ... My Definition of SUCCESS Comes from the World.

But whatever was to my profit I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ What is more, I consider <u>everything</u> a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of <u>knowing Christ Jesus my Lord</u>, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them <u>rubbish</u>, that I may <u>gain Christ</u>... Philippians 3:7-8

Knowing Christ: ginosko – (ghin-oce'-ko) equivalent Hebrew word yada – to know intimately.

Rubbish: skubala (skoo'-bal-a); what is thrown to the dogs, refuse, dung.

...and be found in [Christ], not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ — the righteousness that comes from God and is <u>by faith</u>. Philippians 3:9

KEY: Know Jesus, know peace. No Jesus, no peace.

¹⁰ I want to <u>know Christ</u> and the <u>power of his resurrection</u> and the <u>fellowship of sharing in his sufferings</u>, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead.

Philippians 3:10-11

3) ... I Keep <u>FOCUSING</u> on the Disappointments of the Past.

Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I <u>press on</u> to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. ¹³ Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and <u>straining toward what is ahead</u>, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus. Philippians 3:13-14
