#### PERSPECTIVE #6: Why Worry? -Pastor Dan Morgan / Phil 4:4-9 / 5/27/18

#### Context:

- ✓ The Apostle Paul *planted* the church in Philippi on his second missionary journey around 52 A.D.
- ✓ This is Paul's *"thank you"* letter in 62 A.D.
- ✓ Paul wrote Philippians from a Roman *prison* while awaiting potential execution.

#### I DON'T HAVE TO WORRY BECAUSE ...

# • ... The Lord is <u>WITH</u> Me.

<sup>4</sup> Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! <sup>5</sup> Let your gentleness be evident to all. **The Lord is near.** Philippians 4:4

The LORD is with me; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me? Psalm 118:6

So we say with confidence, **"The Lord is my helper**; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?" Hebrews 13:6

[See also Psalm 138:7-12]

# • ... I Have Direct <u>ACCESS</u> to Almighty God!

<sup>6</sup> Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, **present your requests to God.** Philippians 4:6

<sup>25</sup> "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Matthew 6:25 [See Matthew 6:27-28, 31-33] Key Q: What do I have control over?

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Ps 46:1

### • ... My Heart is <u>GUARDED</u>.

<sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will **guard your hearts** and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:7

Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. Proverbs 4:23

### • ... I Will Set My Mind on Things <u>ABOVE</u>.

<sup>8</sup> Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.
Philippians 4:8

# • ... I have the <u>PEACE</u> of God.

<sup>9</sup> Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the **God of peace will be with you**. Philippians 4:9

Now may the **God of peace** himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Thessalonians 5:3

<sup>28</sup> "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.<sup>29</sup> Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.
<sup>30</sup> For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Matthew 11:8-30
